

DMCA ACCESS APPLICATION

The DMCA is restricted for use by students and staff of Yale's Arts Departments and Arts Institutions. These include the Schools of Art, Architecture, Drama, Music; Departments of Music, Theatre Studies, Film Studies, Art History; the BAC, YUAG, and the A&A Library.

Card access to the DMCA can be obtained by printing this form and leaving it in our "in-box" in the DMCA lobby. Allow three to five days following your application date for your Yale ID card to be activated. You will be notified only if there is a problem with your application.

Note: Card-Access, unless otherwise specified, allows entry only during DMCA 'open' hours, which are Mondays-Fridays 9am-10pm and Sundays 12noon-10pm throughout most of the academic year.

Approved access is required before students may reserve loaner equipment.
