

Privileges and Resources for Graduate Students And Postdoctoral Fellows with Children

Yale offers student and postdoc families with children a wide array of privileges, resources and activities:

Yale Athletics events. Admission to Yale sports events, including college football games at Yale Bowl, and other intercollegiate contests at the Payne Whitney Gym, is free to Yale students, faculty, staff and spouses/partners each with Yale ID, and to their children up to 12 years of age when accompanying their parents. Yale Sports also offers a Kids Club and special Youth Days.

Yale University Art Gallery and **Yale Center for British Art.** Always free of charge, with many family programs and activities.

Yale Bookstore / Barnes & Noble. Offers an extensive children's book section and hosts regular children's story hours.

Yale Children's Theater. Provides family friendly theater events several times a year.

Yale Corinthian Yacht Club Summer Sailing Programs. Yale's sailing center (YCYC, or "yic-yic") in Branford offers summer programs, group lessons for adults and kids in their racing dinghys.

Yale Peabody Museum of Natural History. Offers a wide array of family-friendly programs and exhibits. Free admission to Yale students, faculty and staff with ID, to their spouses/partners with Yale ID, and to their children up to age 3. Parents may wish to purchase an affordable student annual membership for their 3+ aged children. Free admission to everyone on Thursday afternoons.

Outdoor Education Center (OEC). A camp and nature center on a lake in East Lyme, Connecticut, the OEC offers day use and cabins for overnight camping May through September.

Yale summer camps. Yale Athletics, the Peabody Museum, and Bright Horizons @ West Campus offer various fee-based summer day camp programs for school-age children.
