GENERAL INFORMATION

JOSEPH SLIFKA CENTER offers Conservative, Reform, Orthodox, Yoga and Children's Services for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Rosh Hashanah will start at sundown on Monday, September 29th. Yom Kippur starts sundown Wednesday, October 8th. These services, designed by and for the Yale Jewish Community, are open to all – however, any person without a student ID must present a ticket at each service.

RESERVATIONS

Please complete and return the enclosed ticket form – no later than September 17th – so that we may mail your tickets in time for the beginning of the High Holy Days. Those who need to obtain tickets after this date must come in person to JOSEPH SLIFKA CENTER *for Jewish Life at Yale*, 80 Wall Street, New Haven. You do not need to commit to a particular service to reserve your ticket(s), and we encourage families and individuals to select their worship experiences as desired during the High Holy Days.



COST

JOSEPH SLIFKA CENTER *for Jewish Life at Yale* is committed to meeting the religious, spiritual and cultural needs of our community, during High Holy Days and beyond. SLIFKA CENTER is an independent not-for-profit organization that does not receive funding from Yale University. Children under 13 will be admitted free, but contributions for their attendance will be most appreciated. If personal circumstances do not allow you to make a contribution at the requested level, please reserve a ticket at your discretion. Your presence is still desired as our community gathers.

PARKING

Parking passes are available to all ticket holders. These passes must be clearly displayed through your windshield, allowing you to park free of charge in legal spaces during the hours services are held. Yale lots may only be used for evening and weekend services.

RELATED EVENTS

The *Bernard and Norma Lytton Apples and Honey Kiddush* is held at JOSEPH SLIFKA CENTER (80 Wall Street) immediately following services on the first night of Rosh Hashanah. All are welcome.

The *Robert and Louise Arias Yom Kippur Break Fast* is partially underwritten by an endowment, allowing us to offer this festive feast at a greatly reduced price to the whole community. The cost of the meal is \$10 per person, and reservations should be made when submitting your ticket form.

A variety of learning opportunities, discussions, and other activities to enhance your exploration of the High Holy Days will be offered. Details will be announced on our website in late September, and in handouts at services. No reservations are required for these events.
