If you are an educator, curriculum specialist, librarian, or a business or media professional, “The Teaching of Africa” will transform your understanding of the continent and equip you with ideas and practical approaches for instructing students, staff members, or the public. It is an intensive introductory course in African Studies designed to help educators learn about Africa so that they may teach confidently about its peoples, civilizations, and cultures; the course will likewise inform other professionals’ perspectives and enable all participants to identify and access unique resources on Africa. The program includes several hands-on cultural and artistic projects complemented by a full-day field trip to cultural sites in New York City.

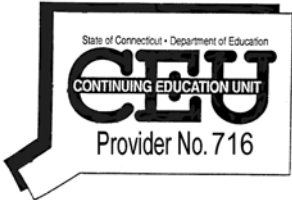
