The European Studies Council of the MacMillan Center invites applications for the European Union Studies Summer Grants from graduate and undergraduate students whose work or research involves the European Union or some aspect of European integration.

Grants are available for Ph.D. candidates who wish either to determine the feasibility of a dissertation topic or conduct research on that topic. Grants are also available to European and Russian Studies and IR Master's students at the end of their first year of study. Grants are available to undergraduates who wish to conduct research or work in an internship related to the EU during the summer before the junior or senior year.

6. Name and department of one Yale faculty member who can comment knowledgeably on your application.

Deadline: Applications must be received by the Council on European Studies, Room 242, Luce Hall, 34 Hillhouse Avenue by **4pm, Friday, February 29, 2008** to be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to see that the complete application reaches us by the deadline. Applicants will be notified of the decision in late April.
