

Stavros S. Niarchos Student Research Grant At the Gennadeios Library 2008-2009

The Hellenic Studies Program of the European Studies Council invites applications to the 2008-2009 Stavros S. Niarchos Student Research Grant at the Gennadeios Library. Graduate, professional and undergraduate students from Yale University, whose work focuses on post-Antiquity or modern Greece and its larger interactions with its neighbors in the European and Balkan regions and beyond, are welcome to apply. The research project must make use of the Gennadeios Library holdings and commit to a period of six weeks. The fellowship will provide funding for round trip transportation, room and board, a book allowance and incidentals for Yale students of exceptional promise. The grant is made possible by the Stavros S. Niarchos Foundation, which supports the Hellenic Studies Program at Yale.

Applications must include:

1. A student Grants & Fellowships database registration page.

2. One completed application cover sheet (attached).
3. A brief description of the location and duration of the research project for which you seek support and, for undergraduates, an indication of how you believe this project will contribute to your understanding of Post-Antiquity Greece and/or its larger regional and international relations. Indicate if your project is connected with a proposed senior essay, MA thesis or Ph.D. dissertation. Priority will be given for projects conducted in Greece.
4. A written approval of your project from the Library's director, Dr. Maria Georgopolou (MGeorgopolou@ascsa.edu.gr)
5. A budget of your total estimated travel expenses and all sources of revenue including funds requested in this application.
6. Attestation by a faculty member of proficiency in languages other than English pertinent to the proposed research, especially Modern Greek.
7. A copy of your most recent transcript.
8. One letter of evaluation from a Yale faculty member who can comment knowledgeably on your application.

A written report of the experience must be submitted at the completion of the award. Grant recipients are required to take one course offered by the Hellenic Studies Program during the academic year immediately following their award. As a result of the award, recipients may be asked to offer a seminar or presentation of their field project results to the Yale campus. Any publication or public presentations resulting from their projects should acknowledge the support of "The Stavros S. Niarchos Fellowship."

Deadline. Applications must be received by **4pm Friday, February 29, 2008** to be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to see that the complete application reaches us by the deadline; applications cannot be considered without this information. Applicants will be notified of the Committee's decision by early May.
