

# The Georg Walter Leitner Program in International and Comparative Political Economy Grants 2008-2009

The MacMillan Center invites applications to the 2008-2009 International and Political Economy Grant Competition. Yale graduate and undergraduate students whose work focuses on international or comparative political economy are welcome to apply. Pre-dissertation funds are available for PhD candidates to prepare for dissertation research. Funds are also available for senior essay support for undergraduates whose essays will focus on some aspect of international or comparative political economy, and for travel fellowships for undergraduates at any level to support an internship or a research project to explore some aspect of the field.

Applications must include:

1. **Application Cover Sheet** (scroll down to next page) - **this form is interactive - please fill out on computer**
2. Signed print-out of student Grants & Fellowships database registration page:

3. A written description of the pre-dissertation research, foreign research study, or internship for which you seek support including location and duration, and, for undergraduates, an indication of how you believe this project will contribute to your understanding of international or comparative political economy. Indicate if your project is connected with a proposed senior essay.
4. A budget of your total estimated travel expenses and all sources of revenue including funds requested in this application. Include project dates / duration. (See "**Budget Worksheet**" third page below)
5. Attestation of proficiency in language(s) of the project site (see #7 at <http://www.yale.edu/macmillan/faq>).
6. A copy of your most recent transcript.
7. Name of one Yale faculty member who can comment knowledgeably on your application

A brief written report of the experience must be submitted at the completion of the award. Recipients may be asked to offer a seminar or presentation of their field project results when they return to the Yale campus. Any publication or public presentations resulting from their projects should acknowledge the support of "The Georg Walter Leitner Program in International and Comparative Political Economy."

The Leitner Program reserves the right to audit your use of its funds. Recipients are advised to keep a log of all expenses associated with their projects, and to save all receipts in case an audit is requested for any reason. If recipients travel under the award, submission of the used airline ticket upon completion of the project is required.

Deadline: Applications must be received by **4pm Monday, February 25, 2008** to be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to see that the complete application reaches us by the deadline; applications cannot be considered without above information. Applicants will be notified of the committee's decision by early May.
