

Stavros S. Niarchos Research Fellowships 2008-2009

Grants for Field Research on Post-Antiquity Greece

The Hellenic Studies Program of the European Studies Council invites applications to the 2008-2009 Stavros S. Niarchos Research Fellowship Competition. Graduate, professional and undergraduate students whose work focuses on Post-Antiquity Greece or Post-Antiquity Greece and its larger interactions with its neighbors in the European and Balkan regions and beyond are welcome to apply. Pre-dissertation funds are available for Ph.D. candidates to prepare for dissertation research and dissertation funds are also available. Funds are also available for undergraduates at any level to apply for summer support for a research project to explore some aspect of Post-Antiquity Greece.

Graduate student grants ranging from \$4-8,000 each may be for summer or longer terms. Undergraduate grants averaging \$4,000 are designated for summer only.

Applications must include:

1. A student Grants & Fellowships database registration page.

2. One completed application cover sheet (see tab below).
3. A brief description of the location and duration of the research project for which you seek support and, for undergraduates, an indication of how you believe this project will contribute to your understanding of Post-Antiquity Greece and/or its larger regional and international relations. Indicate if your project is connected with a proposed senior essay, MA thesis or Ph.D. dissertation. Priority will be given for projects conducted in Greece.
4. A budget of your total estimated travel expenses and all sources of revenue including funds requested in this application (see tab below).
5. Attestation by a faculty member of proficiency in languages other than English pertinent to the proposed research, especially Modern Greek.
6. A copy of your most recent transcript (unofficial transcripts are acceptable).

Grant recipients are required to take one course offered by the Hellenic Studies Program during the academic year immediately following their award. A written report of the experience must be submitted at the completion of the award. As a result of the award, recipients may be asked to offer a brief presentation of their field project results to the Yale campus. Any publication or public presentations resulting from their projects should acknowledge the support of the "Stavros S. Niarchos Fellowship."

Deadline. Applications must be received by **4pm, Friday, February 29** to be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to see that the complete application reaches the The MacMillan Center Fellowships Office, The MacMillan Center, Room 306, Luce Hall, 34 Hillhouse Avenue by the deadline; applications cannot be considered without this information. Applicants will be notified of the Committee's decision by early May.
