



## Yale School of Music

Yale University is a private, independent institution founded in 1701. Semester system: 315-acre campus in New Haven, Connecticut. Yale University is a large research university with a wide array of programs, departments, Schools (Yale College, Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, and 10 Professional Schools), centers, museums, and many affiliated organizations.

The School of Music, founded in 1894, is one of the 10 professional schools at Yale. The School of Music offers graduate professional studies in performance, composition, and conducting. Degrees conferred by the School include the Certificate in Performance, Master of Music (M.M.), Master of Musical Arts (M.M.A.), Artist Diploma, and Doctor of Musical Arts (D.M.A.). The School's facilities are located in the center of Yale's campus.
