CONFERENCE FOCUSES ON CHURCH GOVERNANCE, ACCOUNTABILITY AND THE FUTURE

Dear Friend of More House,

Elevating Catholic intellectual discourse, engaging the participation of Yale Catholic faculty and examining the topics of the day from the perspective of faith have been core components of an expanding ministry at Saint Thomas More Chapel.

To respond to the most critical issue facing the Catholic Church in the United States, the Saint Thomas More Board of Trustees and staff planned a three-day conference on *Governance, Accountability, and the Future of the Church*.

The conference, of a size and scope unprecedented in the Chapel's history, featured thirty distinguished presenters from across the United States and abroad, representing Catholic bishops, theologians, and laity. Together with Yale Catholic faculty, these scholars and practitioners addressed the deep roots of the Church's crisis, offering it hope and inspiration in the face of its challenges.

Opening the conference was the Most Rev. Donald W. Wuerl, Bishop of Pittsburgh, who delivered a key-

note address with a response by Peter Steinfels of the *New York Times*, moderated by Judge Guido Calabresi, President of the Board of Saint Thomas More Chapel.

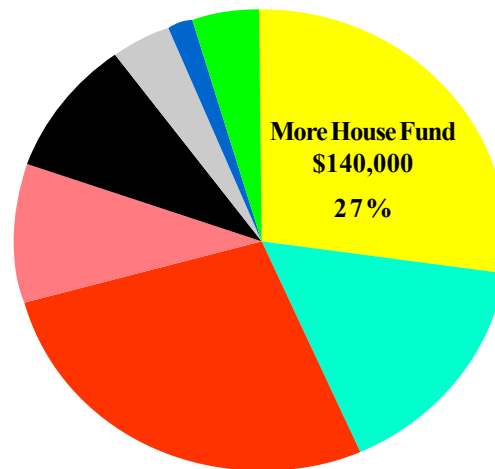

SOCIAL JUSTICE AND SERVICE

It seemed fitting to return home to find several community members waiting to give us rides back to Yale...almost as if the message of the past week was being reinforced: we, together, build communities—communities that support, encourage, and will always be there when you return. How blessed we are to have gone on this trip, and to have a community like this to return to.

I wrote these words last spring at the beginning of my reflections on our Alternative Spring Break Trip to L'Arche Ottawa, and they still ring true today. In addition to the trip to L'Arche during my sophomore year, I was fortunate enough to go to The David School in David, Kentucky my freshman year. Saint Thomas More Chapel has a wonderful tradition of bringing its willing students to an area or community that needs our help, and thereby allows us one more way of living out our Catholic faith by serving others. We have numerous opportunities available to us in New Haven through More House: the soup kitchen, outreach to residents of Sister Anne Virginie Grimes Health Center, tutoring/mentoring at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Grade School, mentoring through the Brennan/Wexler program, the Catholic Worker House of New Haven, Life Haven, Habitat for Humanity, and more. Our programs allow us the opportunity to serve and work with others of the New Haven community—our spring break trips allow us the opportunity to serve the

wider global community. Each spring break trip we have served people who are often misunderstood. In David we learned the effect the end of coal mining can have on a rural-Appalachian town, and also some of the problems with the public school system. We worked side-by-side with the school's students who were also living out their convictions by "learning while serving." For many of them, the David School was their last chance at a high school education. At L'Arche, devoted to serving the needs of the developmentally disabled, we learned to interact with people who had disabilities and to see the wonderful creation each individual person is. We learned about community: the community within L'Arche of core members and assistants, our own community, and even how to be open to community wherever it may be found. Each of the spring break trips I've attended has been a rejuvenating experience for me. Each causes me to reflect on the blessings God has given me and to be thankful for those blessings. Each trip allows me to sense the greater community we have here on earth, and sense the necessity of helping all those in need. Even a year to two years later I am still learning from my experiences on each of these trips, and the lessons I've learned from each of them still informs how I live my everyday life. I am confident that this year's trip will add to the excellent tradition, and am grateful that we students are able to undertake these trips each year thanks to the support of the Chapel and its alumni.

Patron Saints: Shining Examples of Holiness, Models for Our Professional Lives

Devotion to the saints—women and men who have been recognized to be exemplary followers of Christ—is a treasured component of our Catholic heritage. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, "By canonizing some of the faithful, i.e. by solemnly proclaiming that they practiced heroic virtue and lived in fidelity to God's grace, the Church recognizes the power of the Spirit of holiness within her and sustains the hope of believers by proposing the saints to them as models and intercessors" (828). A special class of models and intercessors are the patron saints of individuals, churches, dioceses, persons in particular conditions (e.g. a sickness), and professions.

Over the past year and through the guidance of Fr. Mark Villano, Catholic graduate and professional students at Yale have been "making friends" with the patron saint of their respective professions. Around the feast day of their profession's patron saint (or on another date if the feast day falls during school recess), students, faculty and staff members of each school

have gathered for a reception and prayer in honor of their patron saint. Besides getting together to spend some time with fellow Catholics on campus, they have learned something about how their patron saint may guide and aid their own lives as scholars and believers. There have been moments of meditation and inspiration, conversation and saintly trivia-sharing. For example, this semester, on the feast on St. Luke, patron of physicians and medical workers, students and faculty members of the School of Medicine gathered to celebrate Mass, heard a reflection on spirituality and the healing professions, and shared pizza. We've gone to the School of Forestry and Environmental Studies on the feast of St. Francis. Last year, on the feast of St. Nicholas, the patron of merchants, we had Mass and a luncheon at the School of Management. At each school, students have appreciated the opportunity to meet others who share their faith. This has turned out to be a positive way for the ministry of Saint Thomas More Chapel to extend further onto Yale's vibrant and diverse campus.

Catholic Student Athletes Initiative

Student athletes experience a number of unique challenges and pressures on campus, as well as questions about how spirituality interfaces with their lives. Most Catholic campus ministries lag behind other churches' efforts to attend to this group of students. At the end of the last academic year, we brought together a number of Catholic Varsity athletes for a discussion about various topics related to the connections between faith and sport. A large number of them indicated their interest in continuing that conversation.

This fall, Saint Thomas More's "Catholic Student Athletes" initiative commenced with a great response. Male and female athletes (or "Cathletes," as they like to call themselves) representing various team sports — football, hockey, field hockey, soccer, track, baseball, softball, swimming, crew — have taken part in discussions where Catholic resources are brought to bear on the questions and concerns that student athletes experience. We hope to address several needs with these group meetings. First, the social aspect of the dinners will help students to build relationships and make connections with fellow Catholics with similar interests on campus. Second, input and discussion on the interface between spirituality and sport will provide an educational component that helps students grow as athletes and believers. Third, special guests will be invited periodically to share their own thoughts on a particular topic, or their own experience as a student athlete. These special presenters

will offer models for students looking for insight and inspiration in the present, and guidance for the future.

Although this outreach is new, and it is uncertain how it will develop, initial success is encouraging. Casey Moriarty, MC '05, a member of our community and of the cross country and track and field team, was quoted in a recent Yale Herald article: "Learning to battle back from occasional disappointment and failure that accompanies any sport are skills that will serve collegiate athletes well in their future careers." Our hope is to provide a place where mutual support and insight into the way spirituality and faith can enhance their lives will serve student athletes in their maturation as young adults.

In her poem *Primary Wonder*, Denise Levertov reminds us of something you and I experience so frequently.

Days pass when I forget the mystery.

colored clothes; cap and bells.*

*And then, once more the quiet mystery is present to me,

Our Social Outreach Program extends from tutoring, to caring for elders, to opening our soup kitchen doors each Wednesday, to sharing in an alternative spring break. This year we celebrate our 10th annual Songs for Soup Benefit Concert as well as the 20th anniversary of our Soup Kitchen. Student involvement is overwhelmingly positive as the community participates ever more fully, consciously and actively in the liturgical life of the Center. What you have begun, continues on. The new initiatives and Faith Fellowships respond to the needs you yourselves expressed throughout the years. The

conversation you began continues to be heard and continues to be sustained through the Mystery of God's love and the generosity of many.

Believing that God does indeed sustain each moment, each endeavor, I also believe that when you were at Yale, your contributions to More House sculpted who we are and who we will become. It is exciting to see your creativity, your generosity, and your presence living on in the plans for a new Student Center. May this Center continue to house your dreams and the dreams of all generations to come. May this Center become part of your Yale experience, an experience filled with joy, wonderful memories, great achievements, lasting relationships, intellectual challenges and spiritual growth, all sustained hour by hour by our God, the Hallowed One.
