Just Add Water

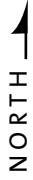
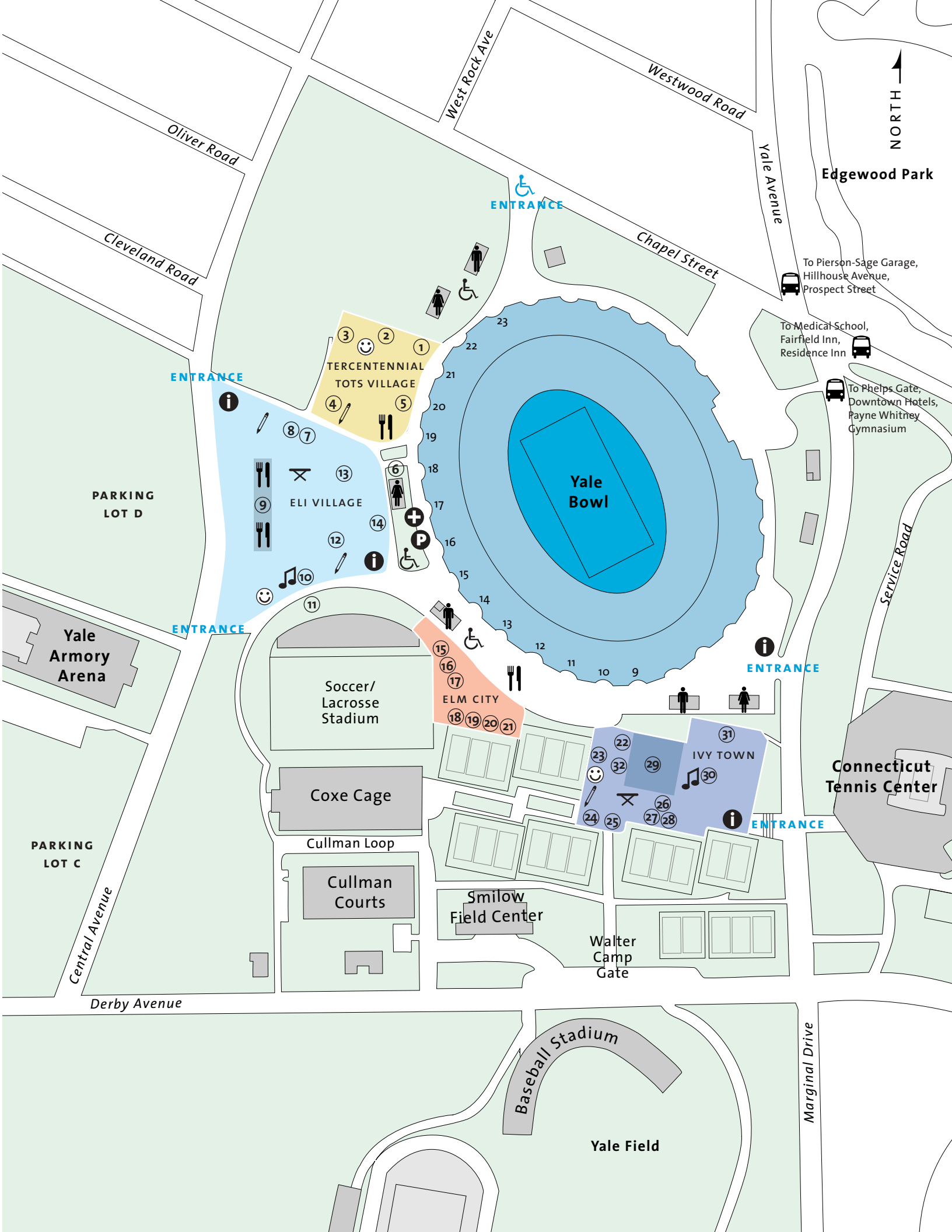
6:00–6:30 PM
