## INSTRUCTIONS

Take this Consultation Form and appended Tentative Program of Study Chart to your meeting with a member of the Yale College faculty or an assistant or associate dean of Yale College to have a consultation about your course of study for the next four terms. Your completing the chart before the meeting will be helpful.

The point is to consult a member of the faculty who is knowledgeable about an area of interest to you and with whom you can talk comfortably. You may choose the faculty member who signed your sophomore schedule, approach the instructor of a course in a department that interests you, or meet with a director of undergraduate studies or departmental representative. (If you are majoring or plan to major in the sciences or mathematics, you should have this consultation with the appropriate director of undergraduate studies or departmental representative.)

Next year for all juniors your faculty adviser will be the director of undergraduate studies or departmental representative in your major. Although directors of undergraduate studies or designated departmental representatives can be especially valuable for this consultation, for the purposes this spring term consultation, you may choose any member of the Yale College faculty.

If you have difficulty finding a faculty member for this consultation, your residential college dean can suggest possible choices.

\* At the end of sophomore year (after 4 terms of enrollment), enrollment in at least one course credit in each disciplinary area (Hu, So, and Sc), and at least one course credit in each skills category (WR, QR, and Foreign Language).

At the end of junior year (after 6 terms of enrollment), all skills requirements must be completed: Foreign Language and 2 course credits each in WR and QR.

For the Bachelor's Degree. At the end of the senior year, all distributional requirements must be completed: Foreign Language, 2 course credits each in WR and QR, and 2 course credits each in Hu, So, and Sc.

No courses taken on a Credit/D/Fail basis may be used to fulfill the distributional requirements. To satisfy the distributional requirements, each course may fulfill only one requirement. Acceleration credits may not be used to satisfy the distributional requirements.
